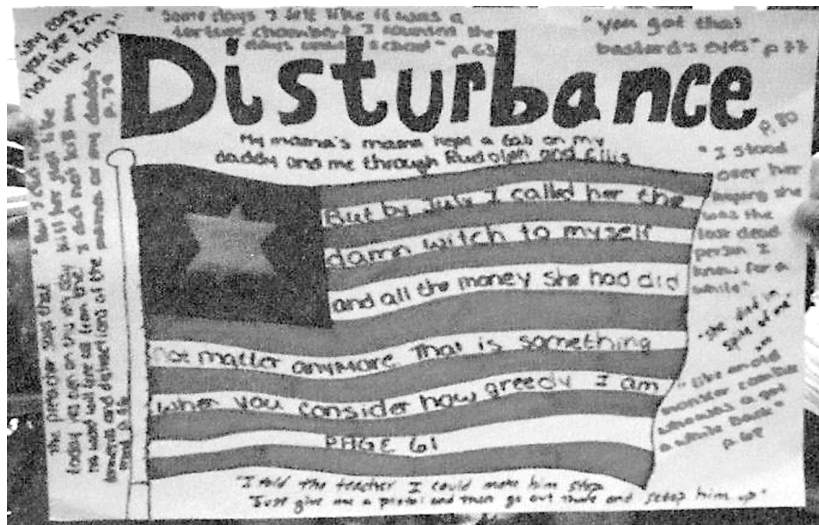


# Animal Farm Graffiti Journal

While you are reading *Animal Farm*, you will keep a Graffiti Journal. You should have one full page for each chapter, and you should create the journal as you read.

Your journal must include the following:

1. **Graffiti** – drawings, doodles, shapes, symbols, colors that help you remember the chapter. Focus on thinking symbolically; don't just illustrate the chapter.
2. **Quotations** – direct sentences from the chapter. Focus on the most important parts of the setting, characters, plot, point of view, themes, and symbols developed in the novel.
3. **Words** – things that come to your mind while you read. Focus on key ideas that are present in the chapter.



Graffiti journals will be graded using the rubric below. Each chapter (there are 10) is worth 25 points for a total of 250 points. You may create your journal in PowerPoint, Photoshop, Illustrator, or any other graphic program. Your journal may also be done by hand. Either way, your journal must be done in color and bound together in some way. Minimum size is 8 ½" x 11".
